






**Figure One:** Robert Dudley, earl of Leicester (1532/3-1588).





#### Map of London and Westminster showing sites of known relevance to William Whittell.





#### Transcription of the last will and testament of Maynarde Bockwaye, taylor of Our Lady in the Strand, Middlesex, proved 26 February 1593.

Maynardj Bockwaye

In the name of God Amen the eleauenth daye of Aprill Anno Domini a thousande fyue hundred eightie nyne: and in the one and thirtithe yere of the raigne of oure soueraigne Ladie Elizabethe by the grace of god Quene of England ffrance and Ireland Defender of the faithe &c. I Maynarde Bockwaye of the parishe of oure Ladie late in Strond in the countie of Midd taylor being weake in bodye but of perfect remembrunce (thanckes be vnto Almighty god) Do make and ordeyne this my present testamente and last will in manner and forme hereafter declared that is to saye ffirste aboue all thinges I commend and submitt my soule into the handes of Almighty god my maker hoping that by the deathe and bloodshedding of xpiste Jesus to haue free remission of my synnes and to be saued and my bodie to be buried where it shall please god to dispose thereof by the discrecon of my executors.

Item I do giue and bequeathe vnto my eldest sonne Abraham Bockwaye the somme of ffortie poundes in money to be paied vnto hym by my executor at his full age of three and twentie yeres. Item I do alsono bequeathe vnto Godfrey Bockwey my younger sonne the somme of fortie poundes of like money to be alsono paied vnto hym by my saied executor at his full age of three and twentie yeres as aforesaied.

Item I do giue and bequeathe vnto Mary nowe my wife the Leases and termes of yeres aswell of and in the house wherein I nowe dwell as alsono of the tenemente nowe in the occupacon of Nicholas Eaton glouer which ar yet seuerallye to come and vnexpired in and by the same. And alsono the reuercon and reuercons of the same tenemente for which I haue allreadye compounded with Mr Coope for ^for^ one and twentie yeres more: she paying for the same seuerall reuercons vnto the sayed Mr Coope or his assignes so muche money as at the tyme of my deathe shalbe by me owing vnto ye saied Mr Cope for the same lease or leases in reuercon. To haue and to hould the same seuerall leases vnto my saied wife for and during her naturall life. Item my will is that the sayed Mary my sayed wife before she shall entermarrye with any person hereafter shall enter into bond ioyntlie with the same person to whome she shalbe so mynded to entermarry vnto my ouerseers hereunder named or twoe of them by obligacon of the somme of twoe hundred and ffiftie poundes with condicon that the sayed twoe seuerall Leases in esse and the reuercon and reuercons of the same to her the saied Marye as aforesaied bequeathed ymediatly after the decease of the saied Mary my saied wife shall be deliuered vnto my saied sonnes Abraham and Godfrey safe whole and vnypayred in any respect vnto whome after her decease my will and bequeste ys that aswell the saied seuerall Leases in possession as in reuercon shalbe and remayne for all the yeres therein then to come: that is to saye the Lease of my house wherein I nowe dwell and the reuercon of the same vnto my saied sonne Abraham and his assignes for all the Residue of the yeres then to come therein: And the lease of the tenement nowe in the occupacon of ye saied Nicholas Eaton vnto my younger sonne Godfrey and his assignes for all the yeres then therein to come: And yf it fortune that either of my saied sonnes shall dye before he accomplishe his full age of three and twentie yeres as abouesaied. Then my will is that the other sonne living shall haue and enioye his parte and porcon alsono of this my bequest. And yf bothe my saied sonnes shall decease before theire seuerall full ages and

my saied wife then living: That then I bequeathe the disposicon of theire saied seuerall porcons vnto the discrecon and appoynment of my saied wife whome I do make and ordeyne to be full and sole executrix of this my present testament and last will. And I do giue and bequeathe vnto my saied wife all the residue of my saied goodes and chattells Debtes plate and readie money towardes the payment of my debtes the dischardgng of my ffuneralls and the performance of this my present <sup>last</sup> and last will. Item I do ordeyne and appoynte John Reue Nicholas Eaton and Peter Bunnye my good freindes to be Supravisors of this my present testament and last will to see the same <sup>dulie</sup> executed accordinge to my good and playne meaninge: And I do giue vnto euery of them for theire paynes therein to be taken twenty shillinges to be paied vnto them by my executor. And my will is that my saied wife at the tyme of the probate of this my will or taking of Administracion vpon the same shall enter into bond with suerties in the somme of one hundred and three skore poundes vnto my saied supravisors or twoe of them with condicon for the performaunce of this my present testament and last will according to my direction by the same. And yf my saied wife shall refuse or shall not enter into bonde withe Suerties in the somme of twoe hundred and fiftie poundes as ys aboue saied vnto my saied ouerseers or twoe of them touching the Delyuery of the saied seuerall Leases and reuercons according to the true meaninge of this my saied will That then my will is ymediatly vpon suche her refusall or deneyall that the saied seuerall leases and tearmes of yeres and the Reuercon and Reuercons of the same as ys aforesaied shalbe and remayne to my saied twoe sonnes and theire assignes and that this my guifte thereof to my saied wife as abouesaied shalbe vtterlie voide and frustrate. Item I bequeathe vnto the poore people of the Strond within the parishe and and Savoye twentie shillinges in money. And to the poore people of the Dutche churche in London ten shillinges. And I renounce and reuoke all other willes and Codicills And do appoynte this to be my last will and testamente. In witnesse whereof I haue hereunto set my hande and seale the daye and yere first abouewritten. By me Maynard Bockwaye. Witnesses hereunto William Sutton Snr/ Xpofer Vincent
