
Appendix I : Distribution of Wealth


Appendix I shows the distribution of wealth in the towns of Hampshire as indicated by the subsidy lists of 1524-5 and by the Hearth Tax of 1664-5. In the diagrams for 1524-5 female heads of household have been marked where appropriate - these include widows and other single women who were recorded as taxpayers. Such information has not been included for Winchester because of uncertainties over the quality of data or for Southampton where the overall figures are necessarily based on an assumption about missing parts of the subsidy.¹ For the Hearth Tax a distinction has been made between chargeable and unchargeable taxpayers and female taxpayers have again been marked. Southampton has been excluded completely in view of the absence of any record for 1664-5 and the information for Portsmouth is necessarily restricted by the heavily rubbed nature of the record. The graphs reveal clearly the disproportionate distribution of wealth which characterised early modern urban society both at the start and at the end of the period. The potential for women to hold considerable wealth either individually or overall is also apparent. It should be noted, however, that these sources are not directly comparable - a tax assessment of £2 in 1524-5, for example, does not necessarily equate with a rating of one or two hearths in 1664-5.





























































Appendix II : Estimates of Population

Estimates of population calculated at various points in time for the Hampshire towns are shown in Appendix II. In each case estimates based on the subsidy of 1524-5, the Ecclesiastical Census of 1603, the Hearth Tax of 1664-5 and the Compton Census (and an average of these two figures) have been included. Methods of calculation are dealt with in detail in the main text. The resulting graphs have been extended to include information recorded in the church census of 1725 and the first official national census of 1801. Where possible, estimates based on the chantry certificates in 1548 have also been included and for Andover (1582), Basingstoke (1652) and Romsey (1681) estimates have also been made based on lists of male householders compiled for the Court Leet within these boroughs.

Many attempts have been made to estimate population from parish registers.¹ The success and reliability of these estimates, often reached by very elaborate calculations or, alternatively, based on some exceptionally dubious assumptions about baptismal or burial rates, have been uncertain to say the least. Moreover, in the past, they tended to obscure the more positive and constructive aspects of parish register analysis. Nevertheless, for three towns, Petersfield, Ringwood and Romsey, calculations have been made in order to explore the relationship between estimates of population derived from static and dynamic sources. The following methods have been used:


- (i) average annual total of baptisms over each decade,
multiplied by 30 and designated by - - - -;
- (ii) average annual total of marriages over each decade,
multiplied by 130 and designated by x x x x x.


The figures for Ringwood and Romsey have been modified to take account only of the urban population rather than the inhabitants of the whole






The results are probably inconclusive. For Petersfield the parish register estimates seem to exaggerate the size of the population and probably bear little resemblance to the actual urban population, especially in the sixteenth and seventeenth centuries. For Ringwood the estimates from 1570 to 1610 seem much more credible and a population of about 1000 at the turn of the century seems to be confirmed by all the available sources. Similarly, at Romsey the estimate of about 1150 for 1600 is also supported on all counts but thereafter the parish register estimates fluctuate wildly and seem much less reliable. Sharp variations in population are inevitable when registers are used because of the effect on aggregate figures of years of abnormally high or low baptisms or marriages. It must also be stressed that these sources were never intended to be a measure of overall population. Results therefore should be treated with great scepticism.































































- (i) Annual Baptisms

- (vi) Annual Surplus of Baptisms or Burials.










































































































Appendix IV : Mortality Indices

It is difficult to reach many firm conclusions about the relative position of different parishes or long-term population trends from the study of mortality as recorded in the pages of the parish registers of Hampshire. Communities varied greatly in size whilst the survival of evidence is very irregular. One method of overcoming these difficulties is to construct an annual index of mortality.¹ All the market towns for which evidence is available have been investigated in this way, along with the three leading towns of the county and a sample of rural parishes. Burials were aggregated and a mean of the annual number of burials for each parish over the whole period was calculated. The index number for the burials in any one parish in any particular year is therefore the total of burials in that year divided by the mean for the whole period (x 100). Years of high mortality when the number of burials was at least double the mean of the whole period are shown in italics. By this means it is possible to identify the major demographic crises of the sixteenth and seventeenth centuries and to trace the social and chronological variations in the frequency severity and geographical spread of mortality crises in the early modern period.
