What will be the key barriers to implementation?



- lack of resources: financial, training, communication
- long-term sustainability for maintenance and updates
- groups with language/cultural barriers
- not understanding the benefit



How will clinicians know the decision aid is available to offer patients?



- share via research & clinical teams, Lynch Champions
- integrate in training, pathways, app, national meetings
- badge with trusted organisations
- posters, leaflets, podcasts, link in letters/genetic test reports



How can people find the decision aids themselves at home?



- QR code, leaflet, social media videos, celebrity endorsement
- television commercials on Lynch Syndrome Awareness Day
- charities and support groups
- Google searches, NHS website
- letter from Genetics clinic
