VENUE FOR SYMPOSIUM & ACCOMMODATION

The Principal Edinburgh Charlotte Square Hotel, 38 Charlotte Square, Edinburgh EH2 4HQ. The Hotel is approximately 25 minutes by taxi from Edinburgh Airport and 10 minutes by taxi from Edinburgh Waverly Station (see map below).

TRANSFERS AIRPORT & TRAIN


