In-between by Gemma Gore

In-between (the closer you look at a word the more distantly it gazes back) is a poem and an invitation to participate in a land-based performance to uncover new relations of interconnection through mark making/writing. This work values liminal zones and questions the distance of inter-connection between language and meaning, and the peripheries between our bodies.

Gemma Gore is a visual artist, researcher, arts educator and writer, based in Southampton. She is grounded in positions of disability, motherhood, queer-ecology and radical vulnerability. Collaboration is a key value and method within her practice to explore her research question: What are the configurations / poetics of care?

Road of life is a meditative audio piece that interweaves interview-style snippets and layered vocal tones, based on a series of voice note memos received by Anna from regional creatives, responding to questions that explored personal experiences of mentoring.
